Airport Information

The primary airport serving the Atlanta metropolitan area is **Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL)**, located ~15 miles from Emory University. ATL is a major international hub offering extensive domestic and global flight connections.

Ground Transportation (ATL to Emory University)

Rideshare and Taxi Services

Rideshare services (Uber, Lyft) and taxis are the most convenient options for travel between the airport and Emory. The journey typically takes 25-40 minutes, depending on traffic conditions, with fares ranging from \$30 to \$45. Designated pickup areas are located outside each terminal.

Public Transit (MARTA)

A more economical option is to use the Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) system. Take the Gold or Red line from the Airport Station to the Lindbergh Center Station, then transfer to the MARTA Bus Route 6 (Emory) heading north. The total travel time is 50-60 minutes.

Driving Directions

For attendees driving to the conference, take I-85 North toward Atlanta. Exit onto North Druid Hills Road and follow local connectors to Clifton Road or Briarcliff Road, which provide direct access to the Emory University campus and nearby hotels. Parking options will be communicated to registered participants prior to the conference.

四川大学经济学院历史悠久、传承厚重，起始于1905年的四川大学经济科，距今已经有100多年的发展史。著名经济学家彭迪先、张与九、蒋学模、胡寄窗、宋涛、陶大镛、胡代光、周春，以及当代著名学者刘诗白等先后在此传道授业或求学。

我院现有教职工135人，其中专任教师115人，教授38人，副教授50人，国家级人才计划入选者2人，文科讲席教授2人，国务院政府特殊津贴专家7人，国家社科基金重大招标（委托）项目首席专家5人，“让·莫内讲席教授”2人，教育部“新（跨）世纪优秀人才支持计划”4人，省级人才计划入选者7人，四川省学术和技术带头人10人，四川省突出贡献专家3人，四川大学“双百人才”计划A类人才1人、B类人才9人。

在《中国社会科学》《经济研究》《管理世界》《American Economic Review》《Journal of Public Economics》等国内外高水平期刊上发表论文400余篇；获得教育部高等学校科学研究优秀成果二等奖1项，其他省部级科研奖项近20项。学院瞄准国家重大需求和国际学术前沿，整合力量，获批成立四川新型智库“现代产业体系发展研究智库”，推进建设四川省教育厅人文社会科学重点研究基地“成渝地区双城经济圈高质量发展研究院”以及四川省金融知识普及基地，全力打造四川大学国家级科研平台培育基地“中国特色社会主义政治经济学研究中心”、四川大学川大学派“长江上游生态文明建设”等学术平台，积极服务国家和地方经济建设需要，加快推进科研转型升级。

在 2025 年 QS 世界大学学科排名中，经济学与计量经济学学科国际排名第 47 位，中国大陆排名第 5；会计与金融学科排名位居全球第 66 位，中国大陆排名第 5。在教育部第五轮学科评估中理论经济学和应用经济学均表现优秀。学院现有教职工 200 余人，其中浙江大学“文科资深教授”2 人、国家“千人计划”3 人、长江讲席学者 1 人、长江学者特聘教授 3 人、国家“万人计划”领军人才 3 人、国家“百千万人才工程”人选 4 人、全国“四个一批”3 人、青年长江学者 5 人、国家优秀青年科学基金获得者 1 人，浙江省特级专家 2 人，享受“国务院政府特殊津贴专家”7 人，教育部新世纪优秀人才 6 人。

学院重点发展的宏观金融、数字经济、民营经济、开放经济和人力资本学术研究方向，已成为学院特色学术品牌。近 5 年来，学院教师主持国家级重大项目 10 项；发表中文期刊论文 600 余篇，其中权威刊物论文 42 篇；发表 SSCI 论文 500 余篇，其中 top 和 A+ 论文 44 篇，出版著作 50 余部，承担省部级以上科研项目 120 余项，获得省部级以上奖励近 34 项。

中欧国际工商学院

中欧国际工商学院由中国政府和欧洲联盟于 1994 年共同创立，是中国唯一一所由中外政府联合创建的商学院。历经 31 年不懈努力，学院已形成在三大洲五地（中国上海、北京、深圳，瑞士苏黎世和加纳阿克拉）办学的全球化格局，成长为一所亚洲顶尖、全球一流的商学院。学院提供多种学位课程，包括全日制全英文 MBA、在职 MBA、金融 MBA（FMBA）、全球管理硕士（Global MiM）、EMBA、Global EMBA（GEMBA）、HEMBA、工商管理博士（DBA）、PhD 和高管教育（EE）等课程。目前，中欧在英国《金融时报》全球 MBA 百强榜单中已连续九年位居亚洲第一，在其全球 EMBA 百强榜单中连续六年位居全球前二。

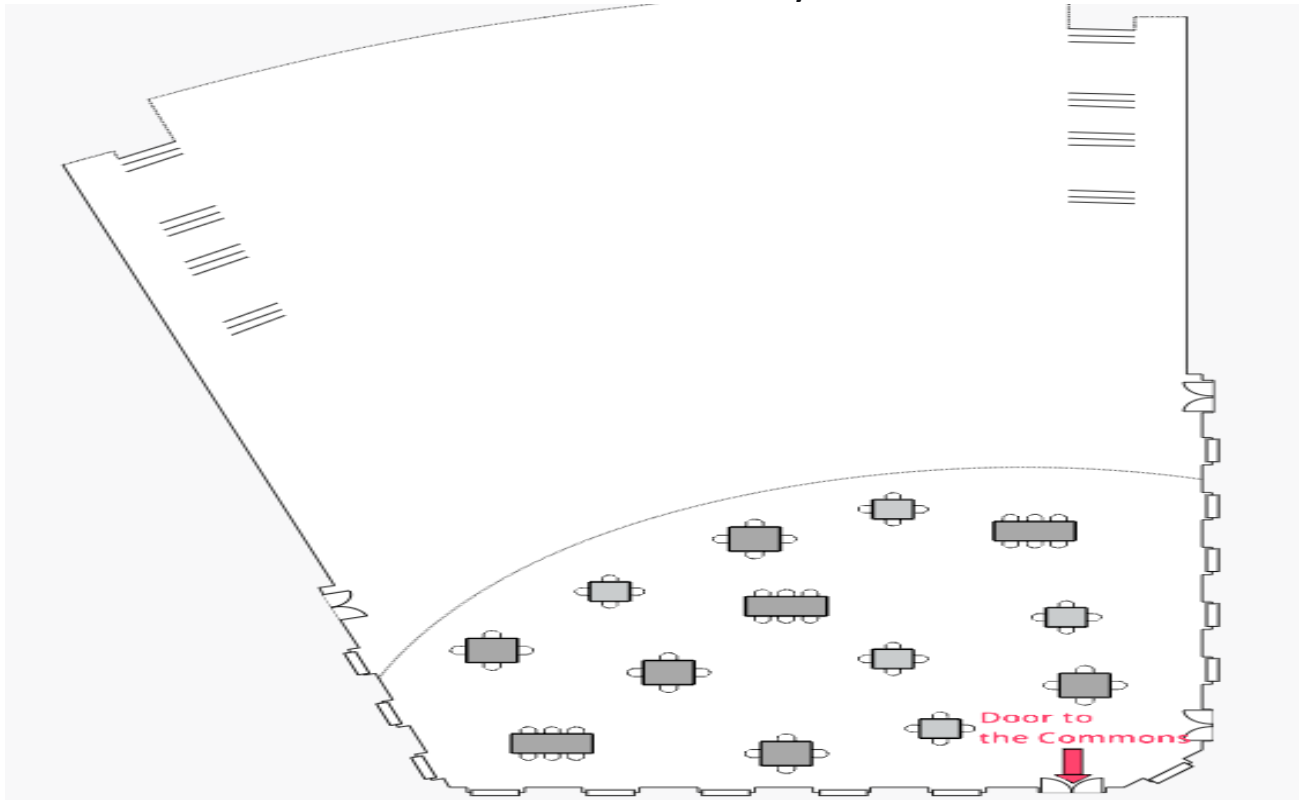
